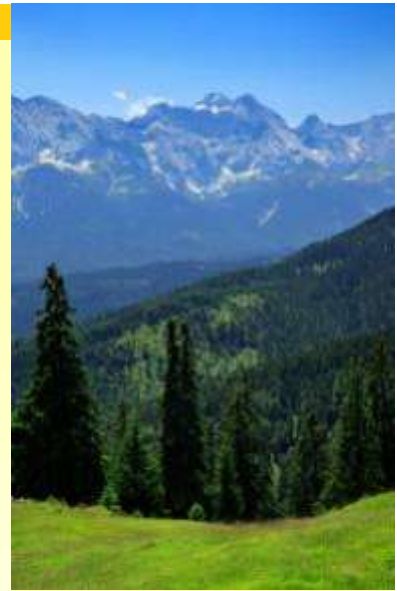

For example:

Strategic Intent III: We make a positive difference in the world.

Objective 1: We engage in spiritual social action that impacts issues related to hunger and poverty.

Goal 1: By June 2010, we implement a “Shoes4Unity” campaign.

Action Steps: 1) Obtain materials 2) Schedule dates 3) Publicize information for the drive 4) Gather volunteers and assign tasks 5) Collect shoes and funds for shipping 6) Sort and package shoes 7) Ship shoes to distribution center 8) Provide feedback to the congregation and Celebrate!

Our Strategic Plan is the work of many hours of the board’s time

and is based on information gathered during our World Café and our Spiritual Social Action HUG meeting. We will continue to involve the ULV community in providing input for annual updates. It will remain a dynamic document with items added each year, items removed as they are completed and potentially, items removed as the goal no longer fits the circumstances or who we are becoming. I take different vacations and while I considered Nashville this summer, that destination is in my prayers but not on my vacation list any longer. We have to understand we are growing. We are able to release a priority that no longer serves who we have become or the conditions around us, and identify new priorities that call to our forward movement. It is important to not only plan but to enjoy being in the process. Our Strategic Plan provides a framework but it is in living in each moment that we truly bring to life the power of Unity of Lehigh Valley. As Spirit reveals our work and the way to accomplish it, I invite each of you to make your contribution to Unity of Lehigh Valley.

Twelve Power Booklets are available in the bookstore for \$1 each (plus tax).

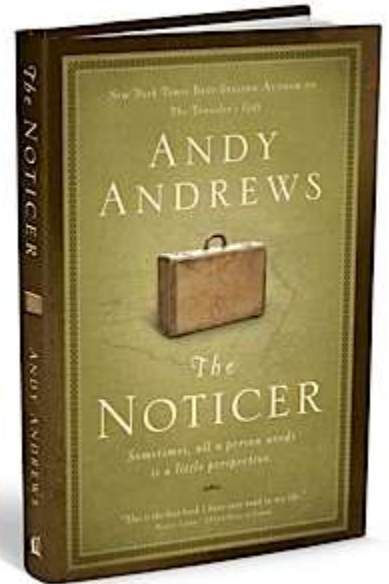

This New York Times bestseller is a delightful fictional story of an old man (The Noticer) who always seems to "coincidentally" pop up when someone needs a change in perspective. 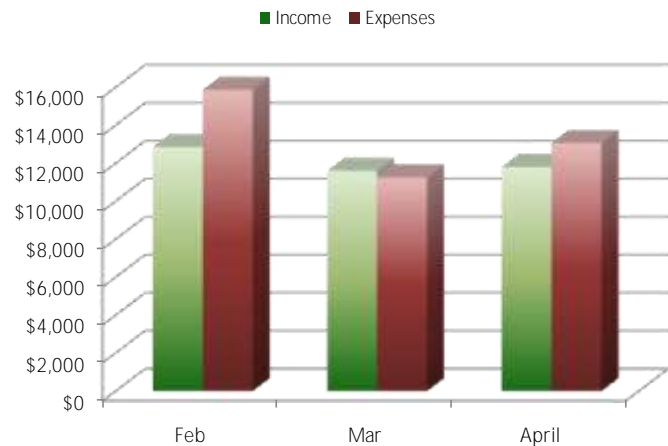
Prosperity Report

⌘ In February, Total Income was \$12,858 and Total Expenses were \$15,869. Expenses were greater than income by \$3,011.

⌘ In March, Total Income was \$11,608 and Total Expenses were \$11,256. Income was greater than expenses by \$352.

⌘ In April, Total Income was \$11,809 and Total Expenses were \$13,071. Expenses were greater than income by \$1,262.

⌘ For the current fiscal year (Nov. 09 to Oct.10) as of the end of April, Total Income was \$76,31 and Total Expenses were \$77,053. Expenses were greater than income by \$222.



In order to keep the flow of prosperity moving, ULV tithes 10% of our income. In addition to tithing to Unity, the Association of Unity Churches, and Eastern Region AUC, ULV tithed to Doctors Without Borders (Haiti), Kalingalinga Foundation (Africa), Turning Point (Allentown, PA) and musician Scott Paul (Emmaus, PA).

Committed Giving Update - Currently we have 23 committed to tithing and 15 committed to giving a specific amount. That is 38 committed to giving out of average attendance of 64. Thank you to our committed community!

SEE in the Field

Monday, June 21st through Friday, June 25th

Spiritual Education and Enrichment (SEE) is the program of classes designed for individuals interested in exploring spiritual topics, deepening their spiritual understanding and maintaining a life-long learning experience. Additionally, if you are thinking about becoming a Licensed Unity Teacher (LUT) or ordained Unity minister, classes must be taken in preparation.

To meet the needs of potential students in our area, Unity of Lehigh Valley is collaborating with Unity Spiritual Center in Asbury New Jersey and Unity Center for Spiritual Living in Bethlehem to offer a variety of courses taught by Unity trained faculty in a convenient, local facility. The summer session will occur in one week on five consecutive days beginning Monday, June 21st. You can take one class, two, three or all four. The courses and faculty for this session are:

Bible Overview, Hebrew Scriptures-Rev. Joy Wyler (12-2 p.m.)

Metaphysics I, Part 2-Rev. Joy Wyler (2:10 to 4:10 p.m.)

Development of the Unity Movement -Rev. Audrey Bickford (5-7 p.m.)

Twelve Powers-Rev. Wilma Alvarez (7:10—9:10 p.m.)

Future sessions will include a Super Saturday session in the fall. The location of each session will be determined by the distribution of registered students. It is hoped that each center will be hosting one of the sessions. For more information on class times, registration and costs, please contact the church office for a brochure or pick up a brochure at church.

Whether you need a course for credit or would just like to stretch your spiritual wings, we hope you will take advantage of these spiritual education sessions.

Shoes4Unity - Update

Shoes4Unity is an innovative spiritual social action program touching lives in our own community, as well as around the world. Our Association of Unity Churches International has partnered with Soles4Souls in an effort to raise 525,600 pairs of shoes to deliver to people in need around the world. This means someone will receive a new pair of shoes every minute of 2010!!

During the month of April, ULV held a shoe drive in which we collected 409 pairs of shoes in 23 boxes!



What is Prayer?

So what really is prayer? And probably, even more importantly, what isn't prayer? How do we pray? When do we pray? Where do we pray?

Let's start with what prayer isn't - prayer is not asking, prayer is not beseeching, prayer is not begging, prayer is not apologizing for our perceived errors, prayer is not bargaining. Oh please God, I will be good for the rest of my life, if only you will . . . (fill in the blank).



Unity teaches a very simple five-step prayer process to help with how to pray as follows:

1. Relaxation - body, mind and spirit
2. Concentration - focus
3. Meditation - clear and relax your mind
4. Realization - listen and receive your answers
5. Gratitude - Thank you God for what is already done

Lei Lanni's Prayer Chaplaincy training teaches a similar simple process to use when praying with others:

- * Breathe & drop to your heart
- * Be aware of God's Presence and Listen from your heart space
- * Open prayer by speaking your name for God
- * Pray out loud
- * Release the prayer to God
- * Express gratitude - thank you God - knowing your prayer has already been answered
- * Amen - always bring your prayers to a close

Have you ever wondered about when and where to pray? Do you struggle with finding the time and the "right" places to pray? Here are some easy ways to find both the time and place to pray:

Every time you are in your car and are stopped at a red light, you have at least 2 minutes to pray - plenty of time to relax, breathe, drop to your heart and express your gratitude for the blessings in your life. And don't worry about when the light will turn green - the person behind you will be more than happy to let you know!

How about setting a daily "date" with the Divine. List it on your calendar, on your Palm Pilot, on your Microsoft calendar or wherever you keep your appointments. Surely you can find 10

minutes in your day when you can keep your date with the Divine Spirit. It will certainly keep your co-workers, family and friends wondering what does it mean when they see "Date with the Divine" on your calendar.

If you enjoy writing, another way to pray is to write a letter to God or to another person. Keep these letters in your journal, mail them to yourself or keep them in your bible. Sometimes when you find the best place to put them in your bible, it will be near a passage that may give you the answer you have been searching for.

For me, prayer is my on-going and continuous conversation with the Divine Spirit. For you, prayer may be something totally different since prayer is always very personal and always between you and your "Divine".

This article has been a prayer from me to you. Thank you God for the love and support I receive from my friends at Unity of Lehigh Valley and for this beautiful newsletter.

Kitchen Remodel Project Overview

Goal: To have a clean, sanitary, functional "warming or prep" kitchen

Estimated Cost: \$10,000 to \$15,000

Basic Renovations would include: New electrical lines and separate circuit breakers needed for all major appliances, i.e. microwave, refrigerator, dishwasher, warming elements, coffeepots; A new drop ceiling with 3 new lights; New laminate walls throughout kitchen; New Flooring; Replace current counters with used Stainless Steel cart-type furniture which can be purchased very inexpensively and moved as



needed. (Since it will not be installed, these items can relocate with us or be re-sold.); Move current stove to outside wall and install exhaust system; Purchase portable dishwasher which can also relocate with us if needed; Retain current sink in the same location to utilize existing plumbing; Retain current refrigerator unless a new stainless steel one can be purchased at a very reasonable cost.

Fundraising: We are pleased to share that we have already received several contributions for this project for more than \$5,000. Plus a very generous member of our congregation has pledged a matching gift for up to \$3,000 -which means that if you contribute \$50 this person will match your gift at \$50 up to a total of \$3,000. ULV Membership Policy

The Free Online Dictionary defines Member as: 1) a distinct part of a whole; 2) one that belongs to a group; 3) a structural unit. These are all good reasons to become a Member of Unity of Lehigh Valley: 1) you truly are a part of a greater whole; 2) you find that sense of belonging and claim your place; 3) individual members are the structural units that build a church-it does not exist without you.

Our Bylaws provide that our board shall adopt a policy setting out the process to obtain and retain membership at ULV. If you missed our last HUG meeting, you may not be aware that we have created a formal policy, made some changes to our practices, and expanded the policy to set out how to transfer membership from another Unity Church and what expectations we have to serve on the board.

Membership now asks individuals to take a series of six (6) two-hour classes. Our intent is to offer the series twice a year. Our first series for 2010 began May 2. The classes include Unity Basics, Welcome to ULV, Prayer in Unity, Prosperity Teachings, Compassionate Communication and Metaphysical Interpretation of the Bible. Each class is an overview and provides a foundation for further classes and **understanding of Unity's teachings. You must attend all sessions and commit to 3 months of committed giving** before membership applications will be submitted for board approval. Class sessions are open to anyone interested in more information or a refresher on the basics.

Transferring Membership from another Unity Church is now a defined process. Individuals are asked to take the Welcome to ULV class to become familiar with our organizational structure, bylaws, and teams.

Membership Renewal asks individuals to actively participate in their ongoing spiritual development by taking at least one class or workshop during the year to maintain active membership. The renewal **form will ask what class or workshop you've taken and the church office will maintain class rosters. If you have taken a Unity class online or at Unity Village, please submit your transcript copy with the renewal form.** This requirement will not become effective until Membership Renewal submitted November 2011.

Board Service invites individuals into a deeper exploration of 5-7 week classes. The courses required include Discover the Power Within You, one of the Prayer classes or Chaplain training and one of the Prosperity classes offered with one year of committed giving. These requirements will not apply to eligibility for the slate of board nominees until November 2012.

Our goal is to support each member on a path of spiritual growth and personal development and to create a strong, conscious foundation for Unity of Lehigh Valley. If you are interested in the policy, it can be found on our website and paper copies are available from the office. If you would like a membership application form, please see Laura in the office or stop by the bookstore on Sunday.
